

2020-2021 Dual Enrollment Information

King's Fork High School

WELCOME!

- Taking a dual enrollment course is an exciting challenge! You are making the choice to take a college level class while in high school. DE courses are rigorous and rightly so because they are taught by college credentialed teachers and will count as college credit. In general, dual enrollment means that the student is enrolled in high school and college at the same time. Some courses count for both high school credit and college credit, while some classes only count for college credit. Dual enrollment is a great opportunity to get ahead and earn college credits while still in high school, thus potentially decreasing the overall amount of college tuition and time spent at the college.

Courses Offered

- King's Fork High School offers the following DE courses
 - English 111-112 (for seniors only)
 - PLS 211-212 (for seniors only)
 - HIS 121-122 (for juniors)
 - MTH 161-162 (depends on your current math level)

- *All class offerings are subject to availability*

DE Enrollment Process

- Step one- Complete the online application to Paul D. Camp Community College
- https://www.apply.vccs.edu/Home/Sign_In/Logon.aspx
 - Make sure you keep your login credentials, especially your PDCCC Empl ID number which you will receive at the end of the application
- Step two- *Normally this would be to complete the VPT placement test. This step has been changed to a GPA requirement for the 2020-21 school year*
- Step three- Submit the DE contract, signed FERPA form, and payment to KFHS by August 14, 2020 and January 8, 2020
 - The contract can be found on the KFHS webpage. Payment amount will be settled over the summer. You can mail a check or money order to KFHS. Online payment options coming soon.

Class Format

Online

- English 111-112 (online)
- PLS 211-212 (Government) (online)
- You will be assigned a computer lab block in which to complete your course work. You will also be expected to complete course work from home as well via the internet.

Face to Face

- MTH 161-162 (Pre-Calculus)
- HIS 121-122 (US History) *subject to teacher availability
- Face to face classes have a KFHS teacher qualified to teach college level courses and classes are taken during the regular school day

Dual Enrollment Programs

- The following slides discuss the different options for taking dual enrollment courses. You are not obligated to fall into a particular category. You will find that dual enrollment is an umbrella term used to describe a student taking college classes while in high school yet, dual enrollment may look different for each student.

Dual Enrollment Programs

General Studies Certificate

- 33 college credit hours
 - Students will need to enroll in courses directly with PDCCC over the summer and/or after school in order to acquire the number of credits necessary
 - PDCCC tracks their progress
 - You will work very closely with the DE Coordinator at PDCCC
 - Students enroll and pay tuition directly to PDCCC
 - Some courses will not count for high school credit but will count for college credit
 - Students begin as early as 9th grade taking classes at PDCCC

General Studies Associate Degree

- 61 college credit hours
 - Students will need to enroll in courses directly with PDCCC over the summer and/or after school in order to acquire the number of credits necessary
 - PDCCC tracks their progress
 - You will work very closely with the DE Coordinator at PDCCC
 - Students enroll and pay tuition directly to PDCCC
 - Some courses will not count for high school credit but will count for college credit
 - Students begin as early as 9th grade taking classes at PDCCC

Dual Enrollment Programs Cont.

- Some students decide to take DE courses and are **NOT** pursuing the General Education Certificate or the General Studies Associate Degree. These students may take 1 or 2 DE courses or how ever many that fit into their schedule
 - Reasons:
 - For college credit, to get ahead
 - For the challenge
 - Maybe they are in a program like IB or GSA that conflicts with taking more DE courses
- Each class you successfully pass (C or better) will afford you college credit awarded by PDCCC
- For classes offered at the high school, students will receive both college and high school credits
 - Indicate to your School Counselor during scheduling which classes you want to enroll in
- The VCCS credits are transferable to most colleges and universities in Virginia
 - It's always a good idea to check with the admissions office of any college or university you wish to accept your credits to verify their transfer credit policies

Tuition Costs

- DE courses cost tuition which is paid to KFHS for the courses offered during the school year which are taught at KFHS
- For summer courses and courses taken directly at PDCCC, you would pay Ms. Wachsmann, the DE Coordinator at PDCCC
- This year's tuition rate is **subject to change** and has not been finalized. The price is \$130-\$300 per course.
- Payment can be paid in full or half of the tuition due by August 14, 2020 and the remainder due by January 8, 2021
- The exact tuition amount will be announced prior to the due dates
