# FACTORS TO CONSIDER FOR COLLEGE

- Grades in all courses (grade point average)
- Rigor of classes
- SAT/ACT scores
- Recommendations from teachers or counselors
- Work and school activities (Resume)
- Community service hours



# COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

- Complete required testing (SAT or ACT)
- Narrow college choices
- Submit applications (online)
- Request letters of recommendations
- Request transcripts
- Financial aid

- Fee Waivers available for students who qualify

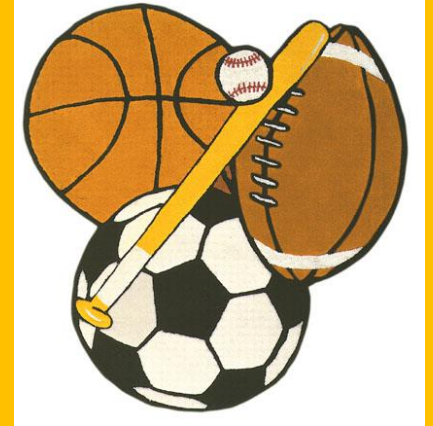
